
At the lodge you can 'social distance' and wear a mask to protect yourself and still enjoy your favorite beverage.

Shine Bright!

The Somerset Children's Center provides in-person and teletherapy for speech and language therapy, physical and occupational therapy for special needs clients ages 3-21. Our state certified therapists provide individualized therapy to their clients, and they also teach parents techniques and strategies to reinforce the skills their children are working on.

Many of our clients are children that are diagnosed with Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD). Children with Autism display different strengths and challenges. Children with ASD learn differently from one another; some may require significant support while others may need less support. Diagnosing ASD is difficult because there is no medical test. It is important that children suspected with ASD be seen by a developmental pediatrician, child neurologist and child psychologist or psychiatrist.

According to the Administration for Children and Families the following are some interesting facts about ASD:

- ASD affects about 1 in 68 children in the US.
- ASD is 4 times more likely in boys than girls.
- ASD is a spectrum disorder which means every child with ASD has different skills, challenges, and needs.
- Early identification helps children get the services they need.
- While there is no cure for Autism, there are several interventions that can help children learn important skills to improve everyday life.
- The earlier children are diagnosed and receive services the better the outcome.

Therapy which focuses on behavior and communication helps with structure and organization. Often times, Applied Behavior Analysis (ABA) helps children learn positive behaviors while discouraging negative behaviors. Occupational therapy helps with life skills, self-regulation, and sensory processing disorders, and visual motor skills, while speech therapists work on communication skills.

I want to thank our very talented therapists who work with children with Autism. Not only do they focus on skill development, they also give them love.





However, the work cannot be completed until the Spring so please keeps your fingers crossed that we will not have bad weather that will compromise the damage any further.

In some good news, the beer cooler that conked out a few years back has been replaced with another cooler that was donated from a very special friend. We thank that family for the donation.

Also in the Good News department is that many members of the Lodge and Auxiliary have ideas on how to raise money and holding events that will draw in new members. It seems that there is a new spirit building amongst the membership that will keep this lodge a place for the "locals" to gather for many years to come.
